## Centres' information

Together with key industry bodies and suppliers we've developed the flexible Level 2 NVQ in Cleaning & Support Services for those who are currently working in the industry.

The flexibility of this qualification enable it to be used in many different applications including:

High risk areas such as hospitals and care homes

Building interiors such as offices

Building exteriors including windows

Food areas such as restaurants

Transport eg buses, train and planes

Highways and Land by both hand and machine

Specialist floor and furnishing cleaning from hard to soft

Caretaking including maintenance, minor repairs and window cleaning.

#### The Industry

The cleaning industry employs around 200,000 people working in 25,000 workplaces with a large proportion employed in carrying out the cleaning process. Whilst it is predicted there will be a small drop in the size of the workforce over the next few years there should be no shortage of prospective candidates.

### **The Future**

The cleaning industry is an essential ingredient to an efficient industry and can make the difference between failure and success, as it can have a direct impact on health and safety which we are all responsible for. The profile of cleaning needs to be raised and cleaners respected. They also need to be given the training and qualifications they need to ensure we minimise risks eg the spread of infection. Cleaning needs to be viewed as a profession and this qualification supports that aim.

#### The Qualification

The NVQ in Cleaning & Support Services is a Level 2 qualification that recognises the skills and knowledge that are required to clean in a broad range of situations effectively and safely. Our NVQs will allow candidates to apply their skills and knowledge to a national occupational level required by employers, thus proving competency in their role. Candidates will need to complete six units to complete the qualification.

## Candidates must complete three mandatory units which include:

- Health & Safety
- Communication

#### and either

- Working as a team
- Working as an individual

# Candidates must then complete a further three technical units choosing from:

- Internal surfaces
- External surfaces
- Routine waste
- · Washrooms and supplies
- High risk areas
- Confined spaces
- Food areas
- Deep cleaning
- Hard floors
- Soft floors and furnishings
- Glazed surface and facades
- Non-routine waste
- · Minor maintenance & repairs
- Manual street cleansing
- Machine street cleansing
- · Working at heights
- · Pole fed window cleaning

This qualification is based on the National Occupational Standards developed by Asset Skills the sector skills council for the industry.

The qualification is accredited to the National Qualification Framework and is therefore eligible for funding.
