

In this unit the learner will:

Use a variety of stitches, threads, needles and tensions to achieve different effects, using both straight and automatic stitches

Use a variety of attachments to produce pin tucks, stitched tucks, buttonholes, shell edges, top-stitched edges, zig-zag neatening, blind hemming and gathers

Use the appropriate attachment to insert a zip fastener in a seam and insert a fabric covered piping cord around a corner, on a sample measuring 15cm square

Use contrasting fabrics and join together 3 parallel strips of fabric, each measuring $2.5 \, \text{cm}$ x $15 \, \text{cm}$ when finished, and join together 6 squares of fabric, each measuring 5 cm square when finished, in a 3 by 2 block so that the corners meet accurately

Use a variety of attachments to attach cords, laid threads, lace and ribbons to the surface of fabrics, using a variety of stitches

Use stitches and manipulation of the fabric to create surface textures, including cross tucking, wave tucking and ruching

Use the darning foot, or fabric held in an embroidery hoop, to work with the machine feed dropped or covered to develop free machine stitches as a surface decoration

Use free machine stitches on a variety of fabrics, including water soluble materials, to produce cut-away effects, open work and fabrics created from stitched threads.

Sample and use as required, textured stitches - french knots, bullion knots, seeding and composite stitches – pekinese, raised chain band, whipped stem

Sample and use as required counted thread techniques - cross stitch, canvas work, blackwork with simple embroidery charts

Use stitches learned to plan and produce a small hand embroidery based on a simple design or colour exercise.

Willow – tie a round slath, complete round base, slype side stakes appropriately, stake up a round base, upsett with a 4 rod wale, change from a 4 to a 3 rod wale, pairing weave, French randing, waling, trac border, **three** rod behind one border, roped cross-over handle, join in new weavers, replace broken stakes, add or remove stakes and pick off finished item

Cane – tie a round slath, complete a round slath, stake up a round base, upsett with 4 rod wale, change from a 4 to a 3 rod wale, change the stroke ('Step up '), pairing, randing, waling, trac border, 3 rod behind one border, roped handles, join in new weavers, replace broken stakes, add or remove stakes, pick off finished item

Rush – tie a round checkweave slath, complete a round paired base, work a base with 'spider' start, work a single stake foot trac, work a waling foot trac, pairing, checkweave, waling, trac border, 3 rod behind one border, twisted rod handle, join in new weavers, replace broken stakes, add or remove stakes, use moulds, dry and trim finished item.
